Note: It is the prerogative of a hike leader to accept or reject members or other applicants from participating in his or her hike, after questioning the applicant on their fitness and experience. It is a privilege not a right to participate in a hike. Day hikers are requested to phone the leader beforehand to confirm their attendance and that the hike is still on schedule.

Introducing the Num-Num Trail in Mpumalanga.

This spectacular trail opened in April 2010 offering 3, 4 and 5 day self-guided hikes through a variety of Highveld terrains. It is rated as Green Flag (moderate to difficult with pristine landscape) by HOSA.

THE TRAIL

The trail is circular and 36.5kms in entirety. Hikers should have a reasonable fitness and agility level. Much of the charm of the trail is that it takes you through rugged and hard to reach terrain. The longest day is 9.5km and the shortest 6.2km, but all sections of the trail are technically difficult: there are steep ascents and descents, swing bridges and ladders to climb. Don't be deceived by the 'short' distances - this is not 'a walk in the park'. Hikers go through hidden gorges, indigenous forests, sandstone labyrinths and ancient grasslands. As a result of extensive land restoration the trail is home to a plethora of fauna and flora – there over 109 different species of indigenous trees identified on the trail, game (blesbok, klipspringers, hartebeest and wildebeest) and lots of birds (bald ibis, fish eagles, purple-crested lories and vultures to name but a few). From June to August there is a stunning display of aloe flowers. There are waterfalls galore – including the Uitkomst Falls which are the second highest in Mpumalanga. Views stretch all the way to Swaziland.

CAMPS

People stay in 5 comfortable and unique camps ranging from wooden huts snuggled into sandstone to renovated 1934 railway carriages. All our camps have hot water, equipped kitchens and indoor and outdoor braai areas. Two camps do not have electricity but plenty of charm. A slackpacking service is available (we transport your luggage between camps) and small honesty shops to stock up on supplies.

BACKGROUND

The trail was built and designed by Albert Bossert. It is one of the first privately owned 5 day trails in South Africa. The booking time is not as long as some other established trails.

WHERE

We are on the R541 between Machadodorp and Badplaas. Approximately 3 hours from Johannesburg, 1.5 hours from Nelspruit and 6.5 hours from Durban.

Example

For a weekend hike, to hire one backpack you will need to put down a R100 cash deposit. You will be charged R20 per day, so the hiring fee will be R40 provided you return the backpack by the end of the Wednesday following the hike. If you return the backpack on the Thursday you will be charged an additional R20. You will therefore be charged a total of R60, which will be taken from the deposit. The balance of R40 will be refunded to you in cash.

All arrangements regarding the hiring of Club equipment are to be made with **Piet Smit (Tel. 031-2662881)** and the items must be collected from / returned to him at **4 Bohmer Place (off Knoll Road, off Blair Atholl Road, Westville)**.

Items must be checked (i.e. count pegs, poles etc.) and cleaned (i.e. wash inner sheet of sleeping bag). Tents, sleeping bags etc. are to be hung out and shaken before returning. If it has rained on the weekend, hang items out to dry as soon as possible after your hike.

From Durban - Take N3 out towards PMB, after Tollgate take the Sherwood off-ramp and turn right under the freeway in to Jan Smuts Highway, up the hill, past Jungle Nursery on the right, turn right under the pedestrian bridge into Tropical Nursery parking, follow the road past trees to the back of the nursery.

From Westville - take the M13 towards Durban, past Westwood Shopping centre, through 45th Cutting traffic lights, down Jan Smuts Highway, turn left under the pedestrian bridge (in front of Naked Ladies) in to Tropical Nursery parking, follow the road past trees to the back of nursery.
