Note: It is the prerogative of a hike leader to accept or reject members or other applicants from participating in his or her hike, after questioning the applicant on their fitness and experience. It is a privilege not a right to participate in a hike. Day hikers are requested to phone the leader beforehand to confirm their attendance and that the hike is still on schedule.

Warning to All Hikers

This year's winter has started off very dry and the danger of runaway veld fires will probably be much greater than usual. The threat of a runaway fire that will cover a huge area of the Berg should not be underestimated. Leaders and hikers should be totally aware of this at all times, and view any smoke and fire in the area in which they are walking as potentially life threatening. Plans of escape, or safety drills should be reviewed often. It is even more important than ever that stragglers NOT be left behind the main group.

Dave Sclanders, one of our hike leaders who runs Bergfree Adventures has noted that there are few signs of preparation for firebreak burning as well. Always keep a lighter or matches handy and be prepared to burn the grass downwind if you find yourself trapped by an approaching fire. You cannot outrun it.

HIKES FROM BUSHMAN'S NEK TRAIL HUT, SOUTHERN BERG 27–29 APRIL 2012 by Kathy Kruger



"There is a way that nature speaks, that land speaks. Most of the time we are simply not patient enough, quiet enough to pay attention to the story"

The Bushman's Nek Trail Hut is situated approximately one kilometer from the South African Border Post and is the last hut on the Giants Cup Trail. It overlooks the Bushman's River and offers excellent views of the far southern KwaZulu Natal Drakensberg, with both Thaba Ngwangwe and Tomathu Peak being visible on the escarpment on either side of Ngwangwane Pass. It is easy to miss the hut from the trail as its natural finish of thatch and stone blends in perfectly with the surroundings.

This was a combined hike with the Midlands Hiking Club and the Mountain Backpackers Club and was ably led by Keith Ashton, whose knowledge and experience of the area and the Berg in general was both informative and interesting. Whilst leaders have an obvious passion for what they do, they nonetheless give up their own time for our benefit and we are indeed grateful that not only do we have leaders who are prepared to impart their knowledge with us but further take on the responsibility of organizing such hikes - without them we would certainly not get the opportunity to explore the mountains as we do.

The huge advantage of using the trail hut as a base is that one's backpack is left at base camp and only day packs are required for the hikes - it's quite a treat for a change and makes walking that much more pleasurable and is far less strenuous on the body. The hut is very stark - there are five separate rooms each housing 3 bunk beds (accommodating 30 persons in total), which are provided with mattresses. Centrally there are male and female ablutions, each with a shower, toilet and wash hand basin, with washing-up facilities separating them. There is no electricity and no hot water, so showers are exceptionally quick as the water is absolutely freezing. Whilst there are no guarantees regarding the safety of ones gear and equipment, there are combination locks on the doors to deter the criminal element. Fortunately our weekend was without incident. After breakfast, the days were spent exploring the area and then in the late afternoons, after braving the showers, we all sat around chatting till the sun went down, shortly after which we'd all prepare our own supper. The chatter continued into the night after which some of us took to star-gazing - we took the liberty of putting mattresses out on the grass in front of the hut, huddled together under our sleeping bags and lay looking up at the vastness of the sky, every now and then catching a glimpse of a passing satellite or a shooting star, which evoked much elation.

Despite the howling wind on the first day, we had a pleasant hike and explored the area in the vicinity of the hut. Fortunately the weather gods were kind to us for the remainder of the weekend and we were blessed with hot, sunny weather. We saw a large herd of Eland twice (presumably the same herd) and a jackal, which displayed its speed and agility by motoring it up the mountain. On day two we hiked past Cedric's Pool, which is usually very inviting on a hot sunny day, but somehow loses its appeal as it edges closer to winter. We walked in the direction of Lammergeier Cave, stopping on route to view some rather obscure Bushman paintings. We later stopped for lunch at Surprise Cave,

where Bushman paintings abound - quite fascinating if you're into that sort of thing. We headed back to base camp after a long and lazy lunch, stopping again at Cedric's Pool where some of the group braved its icy waters. On day three we did a relatively easy hike, following the Bushman's River, with its crystal clear waters, upstream, eventually stopping for lunch on some rocks further down the river. We returned via the trail leading to the border post, encountering a rinkhals on the way (incidentally, this was the second snake of the day - the other one, of unknown species, was spotted in between the vegetation and rocks, at our lunch stop) - fortunately it was well spotted by a member of the group and after a few photographs, both the snake and ourselves went our separate ways.

All too soon the long weekend was over. We bid farewell to our fellow hikers and headed for home, rejuvenated from our weekend away, once again ready to face the rat race, until the next hike.

Graded 2-3, the weekend's hikes were easily managed by the majority of the group, averaging approximately 10-15km a day, with Day 2 being the most strenuous in terms of the distance and terrain. Hiking is a wonderful past-time - it gives one the opportunity not only to integrate with nature, but also to meet people who share a similar passion and to just escape, albeit for a little while, to a place where time stands still and where the everyday stresses of modern living can be forgotten. No matter one's background or age, hiking offers something for everyone and unites people in a way that few other activities do.

Thanks again to Keith and the group for making the weekend a memorable one. No doubt some of us will meet up again on a future hike.

Congratulations to John Pickup and his merry band for completing the 2012 Grand Traverse of the Drakensberg in fine style. He lost only one person along the way. And a second congratulations for attracting nineteen people, including some first-time hikers to do the resupply up Tsetseke Pass (plus a special thanks to all of them).

Example

For a weekend hike, to hire one backpack you will need to put down a R100 cash deposit. You will be charged R20 per day, so the hiring fee will be R40 provided you return the backpack by the end of the Wednesday following the hike. If you return the backpack on the Thursday you will be charged an additional R20. You will therefore be charged a total of R60, which will be taken from the deposit. The balance of R40 will be refunded to you in cash.

All arrangements regarding the hiring of Club equipment are to be made with **Piet Smit (Tel. 031-2662881)** and the items must be collected from / returned to him at **4 Bohmer Place (off Knoll Road, off Blair Atholl Road, Westville)**.

Items must be checked (i.e. count pegs, poles etc.) and cleaned (i.e. wash inner sheet of sleeping bag). Tents, sleeping bags etc. are to be hung out and shaken before returning. If it has rained on the weekend, hang items out to dry as soon as possible after your hike.

From Durban - Take N3 out towards PMB, after Tollgate take the Sherwood off-ramp and turn right under the freeway in to Jan Smuts Highway, up the hill, past Jungle Nursery on the right, turn right under the pedestrian bridge into Tropical Nursery parking, follow the road past trees to the back of the nursery.

From Westville - take the M13 towards Durban, past Westwood Shopping centre, through 45th Cutting traffic lights, down Jan Smuts Highway, turn left under the pedestrian bridge (in front of Naked Ladies) in to Tropical Nursery parking, follow the road past trees to the back of nursery.

From PMB, from Hillcrest take the N3 past the Pavilion and four-level interchange, take the Sherwood glide-off, keep left in to Jan Smuts Highway, past Jungle Nursery on right, turn right under pedestrian bridge in to the parking of Tropical Nursery, follow road to the back of Tropical Nursery.
